Fusing Louis Vuitton's distinctive design signature with the Maison's unparalleled high jewellery savoir-faire, this collection stands as the largest to date, boasting over 170 unique pieces, including a remarkable 95 in its inaugural chapter, and a record-setting abundance of precious stones. Francesca Amfitheatrof invites us on this exceptional adventure, stating, "At Louis Vuitton, we are perpetual adventurers, venturing into extraordinary, unexpected realms. Deep Time will transport you to a remote era, difficult to comprehend, yet the treasures within - stones that span millennia - will bring you to the genesis of our planet and into the mystical geological legacy of our world." This immersive narrative unfolds in two acts: Geology and Life. 16 themes, 13 unveiled in the collection's debut, intricately capture the epic tale of transformation, life, and interconnectedness. Geology, the first act, unfolds the planet's evolution, from the ancient Gondwana supercontinent to the explosive powers of Volcano, Wave, and Rupture. Louis Vuitton's iconic V, bold and graphic, resonates through the collection, accentuated by custom-cut LV stones radiating with inherent power. The final chapter, Drift, encapsulates the sun and sea with a stunning interplay of aquamarines and yellow sapphires, setting the stage for Deep Time's second act.

Life, the second act, unveils an intricate and sophisticated universe where the life force propels creation, seamlessly transitioning from the graphic to the organic. Eight captivating themes, including Origin, Fossils, Seeds, and Flowers, showcase a seductive play of textures, layers, and the most enchanting stones. The jewels, increasingly versatile, embody Amfitheatrof's commitment to transformability, allowing for multiple ways of wear.



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

Crafted with unparalleled skill, the versatile brooch took 2.000 hours to design, set the stones, and complete, underscoring the enduring legacy of the Tiffany Diamond. This transformative masterpiece marks a new chapter in the love story between the iconic gemstone

and the legendary Bird on a Rock, blending freedom and joie de vivre. The Tiffany Diamond, a symbol of visionary artistry and innovation, originated as a 287.42-carat rough diamond in South Africa in 1877, eventually becoming one of the world's most famous fancy yellow diamonds. Its journey, under the meticulous direction of Tiffany & Co.'s Chief Gemologist Dr. George Frederick Kunz, culminated in a cushion-shaped 128.54 carat brilliant, boasting unprecedented brilliance with 82 facets. Worn by notable figures, including Audrey Hepburn and Lady Gaga, the Tiffany Diamond continues to captivate in each transformation.
